May 7 – 31, 2024: Solo Art Exhibit "Blooming in Downeast Maine" by Liv Pearl (Olivia Dyer)

The Ellsworth Public Library hosts "Blooming in Downeast Maine", a solo art show by Liv Pearl (Olivia Dyer) which is on display from Tuesday, May 7 until Friday, May 31 in the library's Riverview Room. The art show can be viewed during regular library hours, however, visitors are advised to check in with the library staff or go to ellsworthlibrary.net to confirm the room isn't occupied by a library program at a particular time.

Liv Pearl (Olivia Dyer) Art is inspired by her surroundings in Maine, as well as a variety of art influences. Liv blends age-old themes with a contemporary art style. The artist explores themes of community, florals, womanhood, and mental health in her works. Dyer is interested in representing authentic, yet stylized expressions of her lived experiences in Downeast Maine. She has an enduring appreciation for flowers, associating their likenesses with peace and beauty.

May 30 at 6 PM – 7 PM: Author Talk & Book Signing with Mark Borton: Moondoggle (2023)

Author Mark Borton will be at the Ellsworth Public Library on Thursday, May 30 at 6 PM to discuss his book "Moondoggle - Franklin Roosevelt and the Fight for Tidal-Electric Power at Passamaquoddy Bay" (Down East Books, 2023). It's a dramatic tale about the world's biggest electric power plant just off the coast of Maine and New Brunswick that never was.

US President Franklin Roosevelt proposed to build the world's largest hydro-electric generating plant in Maine using the ocean tides as the source of power. In 1935 the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and 5,000 employees began building it. Was Franklin Roosevelt's plan to use 26-foothigh tides in the western Bay of Fundy to generate electricity a "Moondoggle"— a wildly impractical scheme - as its critics claimed? Or was it visionary thinking and brilliant engineering—a clean source of perpetual power? Either way, it was going to be the world's biggest electric power plant - and require seven miles of dams to enclose 150 square miles of the Atlantic Ocean.

Books will be available for sale (cash, check, credit card, and Venmo) and can be signed by the author.

Mark C. Borton was the creator, and for 13 years, the publisher of the "Embassy Boating Guide" series of books covering the east coast of the United States from Maine to Florida. The New York Times said, "Embassy Guide is all that most skippers will want or need to know," and Sail magazine called it, "The ultimate guide in copious content and style." The four volumes have gone through a total of 41 printed editions and have sold more than one quarter of a million copies. Borton also created the Maptech Waterproof Chart series, which now includes 92 titles.

Ellsworth's historic Tisdale House has been home to the **Ellsworth Public Library** since 1897. The library hosts a collection of more than 46,000 in-house items, including books, large print books, audiobooks, movies, music CDs, and its growing Library of Things. In 2023, the library ran 470 programs for all ages. Patrons have access to over 8 million items from 63 libraries statewide as well as subscriptions to 50 print publications and online access to streaming and download services as well as to the New York Times.
