On Thursday, March 20 at 6 PM, the library will present Jim and James - A Literary and Musical Evening in partnership with The Grand.

EPL librarian Joanna Sands, The Grand's Executive Director Nick Turner, and lead actors Jeff Ferrell (Jim) and Hunter Jones (Huck Finn) will come together for a discussion on James by Percival Everett and Big River which opens April 4. Both are adaptations of Twain's Novel - yet very different in their approach. While *Big River* (1985) largely follows Mark Twain's original story with a focus on adventure and friendship, *James* (2024) reimagines the story by centering Jim's perspective, challenging and deconstructing Twain's portrayal.
