The Ellsworth Public Library builds solid foundations of literacy and curiosity for lifelog learning by providing early literacy, reading, as well as creative and movement-based programs every week. EPL's purpose is to provide the community with equitable access to its resources. **The combined value of its collection in December 2024 equaled \$1,084,103.18**. This number does not include services and programs offered, items available through video and streaming platforms Kanopy and Freegal+, nor items accessible through interlibrary loan services.

## **National and Maine Education Stats**

In a 2024 state-by-state education status rating, Maine ranked #37 (#34 in 2023). Nationwide, 68% of fourth-graders were not proficient in reading and 74% of eighth-graders were not

proficient in math in the year 2022.1

In recent years, Hancock County recorded the lowest percentage of high-quality child care facilities and ranked low in the enrollment of four-year-olds in public preschool programs compared to other counties in Maine. Prioritizing the educational needs of children under five is crucial for fostering long-term success. Additionally, Hancock County had the second-highest proportion of children lacking health insurance. It was also one of two counties where the rate of chronic absenteeism among secondary students increased during the 2022-2023 academic year compared to the prior year.<sup>2</sup>

An Ellsworth Public Library Card opens the door to a collection of more than 46,000 in-house items including books, large print books, audiobooks, movies, music CDs, and a growing Library of Things. Patrons have access to 50 print publications, streaming and download services. The New York Times is available to patrons on public access computers or any personal device. Additionally, patrons can request books through statewide Interlibrary loan services and reserve free passes to many renowned Down East museums. All library programs are free and open to all. Through a partnership with the Ellsworth American, anyone using the library's Wi-Fi connection is granted free access to ellsworthamerican.com. <a href="https://www.ellsworthlibrary.net">www.ellsworthlibrary.net</a>
